1. What are the main concerns or issues you hope to address during your term?
I hope to develop strategies to pay on the bonds for the water treatment facility in Fernley. I would like to open better lines of communications within the council, staff, Fernley residents and other government entities.

2. What is your position on development impact fees?

We could also look to expanding our customer base, such as incorporating Wadsworth and providing the Wadsworth area with water. We could look at refinancing from a 20 to a 30 year loan. We need to try to keep the costs of s of all three of the services the city provides in check We should encourage seeking grants and other funding sources wherever possible.
